Avenue. Please know that this is a direct reflection on every one of us and our commitment to the community that we never let our love of our community, state and nation waver.





<u>Memorial Day 2016</u>

It is that time of year again that we need to secure a Main Speaker for our Annual Memorial Day Program.

The American Legion Department of Wisconsin Americanism and Government Scholarship

The Americanism and Government scholarship program fosters interest in all levels of government, citizenship and provides students the opportunity to receive recognition and scholarships. Students are tested on their knowledge of U.S. Government, Wisconsin Government, County Government, the U.S. Constitution and flag etiquette. Students are also required to answer an essay question at the end of the test. This is not an open book test and students are not allowed to use outside resources.

Students are able to access the test in 3 easy steps! Test is accessible April 4, 2016—April 15, 2016

- 1. Click on the test link found on the www.wilegion.org website. Click on Programs, click on Americanism and Government Scholarship.
- 2. Complete registration and log in using the email and password you created.
- 3. Begin test!

Students have 1 hour to complete the test. All answers will be final. Attempting to restart, pause, close the browser, or hit the back button will terminate the test without an opportunity to continue. Students failing to complete the essay question will be ineligible for a scholarship.

Any Student in the 10th, 11th, or 12th grade in any public, private, parochial or home-schooled within the state of Wisconsin may participate.
