





Message from Auxiliary President:

A warm hello to all of you. Thanks to everyone who attended our September meeting. We approved a yearly meeting schedule. The Auxiliary will meet in February, March, April, May, June, August, September, and November. In

December, we will go out to eat for our Christmas party and we can discuss any items informally at that time. Therefore, we will not meet in January, July, and October.

We discussed information provided from State Headquarters about declining membership nationwide. What can we do to help this problem? How can we increase membership in our own unit? If you know of anyone eligible for the Auxiliary, please invite them to join our wonderful unit.

Who is eligible to join the Auxiliary? All women who are eligible for membership in the Auxiliary (this includes step-relatives) fall into one of the following categories:

- The mothers, wives, daughters, sisters, granddaughters, great-granddaughters and grandmothers of members of The American Legion.
- The mothers, wives, daughters, sisters, granddaughters, great-granddaughters and grandmothers of those who served in the Armed Forces of the U.S. during any of the eligibility periods and who died in the line of duty during such service, or who, having received an Honorable Discharge, died after such service.
- The mothers, wives, daughters, sisters, granddaughters, great-granddaughters and grandmothers of those who were citizens of the U.S. and who served during any of the eligibility periods in the Armed Forces of any of the governments who were allies of the U.S. and who died in the line of duty during such service, or who, having received an Honorable Discharge, died after such service.

- Women who are eligible for membership in the American Legion in their own right. The **Membership Eligibility Requirements** and **Membership Applications** are available at <u>www.amlegionauxwi.org</u> under Membership. Please call me if you have questions. Our **next meeting is Wednesday, November 2nd**, with Pot Luck at 6:00 p.m. and our Meeting

at 6:30. We will have many items to discuss, so please attend if you can.

Commander's Special Message

Many of you know, or maybe you don't, that Legionnaire Daryl Brye decorates our veterans' graves with flags in the cemeteries that we serve before every Memorial Day. After Labor Day, he takes the flags down and turns in the unserviceable ones to be properly disposed of. He gave me permission to print this prose that he wrote in true Navy tradition:

Commander Hess:

Our area cemeteries that have been graced with the colors of our nation, once again seem bare. The flags that have shown a season of remembrance for those veterans that have gone before us wave no more.

Those flags - brilliant colors waving atop arrow-straight staffs, had shown some wear. The wooden posts had been bent by winds blowing across the graves of those buried in the land of the free. The radiant red, white, and blue had faded in our summer sun. Some tattered, others torn. A few had nearly separated completely from their poles, but were determined to hang on.

Beaten, faded, tattered, torn, bent, and broken. None of them simply 'took a knee'. These flags have served us well and are ready for their ceremonious retirement and disposal.

Again, thank you shipmate, for this simple honor.

The thanks goes to you Daryl, for providing this valuable service to the memory of our deceased veterans with the reverence and respect that is befitting them.
