The Senate passed the "Forever GI Bill" legislation recently that is the largest expansion of veterans educational benefits in a decade. With senators' unanimous consent, the bill moves to President Trump's desk to become law. This will end a 15-year limit for veterans to use their educational benefits, restore benefits to veterans whose schools abruptly close and fix a Pentagon deployment authorization that has kept about 5,000 reservists from accumulating earned educational benefits.

The Harry W. Colmery Veterans Educational Assistance Act of 2017 -- named after the Past American Legion National Commander -- was introduced July 13 in the House, passed through the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs on July 19 and approved in the House as a whole with a 405-0 vote on July 25. It was introduced in the Senate on July 20 and passed through the Senate Committee on Veterans' Affairs on July 26.

There were many hurdles to negotiate earlier this year, such as how to fund the \$3 billion that the measure is expected to cost in the next 10 years. This measure is a combination of 18 different bills and negotiations had broken down between veterans organizations and Congress. But veterans organizations would not let this go and reignited the momentum for GI Bill Expansion by contacting Congress and Senate members and urging action on this measure.

The bill has widespread support among veterans and higher education organizations. It has been dubbed the "Forever GI Bill" because it removes the 15-year deadline to use educational benefits. That restriction will be gone for veterans who were discharged on or after Jan. 1, 2013. The bill also eliminates "Post-9/11" from the GI Bill's title.

American Legion Regional Baseball Tournament

As many of you are aware, the American Regional Baseball Tournament had to be relocated from Coon Valley to Prairie du Chien due to the July 19 & 20 flooding of Coon Creek that left the ballfield under 4-5 feet of water and debris. This resulted in Westby/Coon Valley to have to make at least a 100-mile round trip every day of the tournament. The boys won 21-9 against Fennimore in the first round, lost to Viroqua 4-8 in the second round, beat Crawford 5-2 in the third round, and lost a close one again to Viroqua 3-4 in the final day of competition. Prairie du Chien won the Class A Regional Championship by beating Viroqua 11-2.

Two local teams who did well at the State Tournament were Holmen and West Salem, who both won state championships in their divisions. West Salem went on to take second place in the Division 2 Central Plains Regional Tournament in Wahpeton, ND, losing to Pierz, MN 5-3.

Troutfest

Much like the regional baseball tournament, Troutfest was severely affected by the flooding in July and had to be cancelled. We sincerely hope that they recovered all that was lost in the flooding, including their information booth, which was uprooted from its footings and floated downstream, after getting caught up on the Hwy 14/61 bridge across the creek. We look forward to partnering with Troutfest again next year.

Endorsement for National Vice Commander

A resolution was passed at the Wisconsin State Convention to endorse Roger P. Mathison from Post 116 as Wisconsin's Candidate for National Vice Commander.
