

The Vernon County Veterans Service Office will be increasing some of the costs of travel to VA sanctioned appointments. Current costs are: La Crosse=\$5, Tomah=\$10, Madison=\$20, other location's costs disclosed at the time of the appointment.

As of February 1st, 2018 the costs will increase for VA sanctioned appointment trips to La Crosse and Tomah. New rates will be: La Crosse=\$10, Tomah=\$15, Madison=\$20. If your VA appointment is in another location, the cost per trip will be given to you upon notification of the Vernon County Service Offices of your VA sanctioned appointment.

<u>Note:</u> The Veterans Service Office ONLY provides travel to VA sanctioned appointments, which includes Veterans Choice appointments. Some veterans who have numerous or continuously ongoing appointments may see different charges based upon their situation.
